Ancestral and traditional territory of the Anishinabek people.










## Watershed Manitouwabing

The majority of McKeller Township lies within the Seguin River watershed that originates from Almaguin Highlands and flows southerly toward Parry Sound Harbour. Damming at Lorimer Lake/ Grey Owl Lake and in Hurdville, is used to maintain and control water levels, safeguard floodplains and sustain surrounding wetlands.

Five smaller river/creek inflows from surrounding lakes, pool into Manitouwabing Lake
